


Information resources available via the Santa Cruz Public Library Website

As you use the library's datafiles, you'll be asked for your Library card number and password, so have them handy.

1. Go to <http://santacruzpl.org/>
2. Click on **Research**




3. You can select a group of databases (e.g., Articles, News & Encyclopedias; Arts & Literature). **For the purposes of this Guide**, scroll down a bit and click on **List A to Z** (over on the left).



You're given access to 45 premium research databases to which the library subscribes, and an additional 60 or so high quality resources grouped by broad subject category.

EXAMPLE 1 Scroll down and click to bring up Ebscohost MasterFILE

1. Type in keywords and click on **Search**



You might want to play around with using Advanced Search mode. Also, you can limit results that include full text, and can have results presented in descending order by date.

2. Select articles you want to read. For example, you might select this one:



EXAMPLE 3 Scroll down and click to bring up Academic Onefile

Academic Onefile Peer-reviewed, full-text articles for academic research from the world's leading journals covering the physical and social sciences, technology, medicine, engineering, the arts, technology, literature, and many other subjects.

1. Type in **keywords** and click to **Search**



NOTE: in most databases, you can use quotation marks to keep words next to each other.

2. Select the materials you want and click to retrieve them.
